Established in Malta in 1988 under an agreement concluded between the IMO and the Government of Malta, IMLI started its first programme in 1989. Its main purpose was, and remains, to train maritime professionals worldwide, with a particular focus on developing countries, in international maritime law. Over the last 35 years, IMLI's work has contributed to the establishment of a cadre of experts in international maritime law who are able to prepare, review and advise on the implementation of maritime laws and regulations.

The Institute has successfully carried out for the last 20 years a joint project with the Nippon Foundation entitled 'Human Resources Development Project for the Advancement of a More Effective Global Legal Order for the Oceans'. The project focuses on enhancing capacity in national governments in the full spectrum of international maritime law. The Institute provides training in its master programmes for deserving candidates who spend one academic year at IMLI to receive quality education in international maritime law. As part of their studies, students carry out supervised research in various areas of international maritime law and prepare a maritime legislation drafting project which incorporates and adequately implements an international instrument in domestic law.

In 2024, the European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA) awarded the Institute a contract for services in the amount of Euro 600,000. Through this contract, EMSA sponsors the studies of suitable government officers from beneficiary countries, in the Institute's masters' and research degree programmes. The later programme leads to the Ph.D. Degree in International Maritime Law.

In 2024, Lloyd's Register Foundation (LRF) awarded the Institute a grant in the amount of over GBP 1,000,000. The five-year grant aims to facilitate the studies of 16 government officers in the Institute's master programmes, the organization of tailor-made specialized courses in international maritime law, as well as the conduct of research in areas of interest of LRF.





	LRF also provided a grant to IMO-IMLI-WMU to carry
	out research in the field of safety of domestic ferries. The research will be completed in 2026 and will lead to the preparation of a Manual on Safety of Domestic Ferries as well as training materials in the subject-matter.
